She is the daughter of the late Anthony P. Togba, Sr. and Mrs. Claudia Bates Togba. She is the fourth of seven Togba children.

Karen's father who was the Deputy Defense Minister of Liberia was killed by rebels in 1990 during the civil war that was occurring in Liberia. Following her father's death, her mother decided to relocate the family to the United States of America. They initially settled in Richmond, Virginia where she attended and graduated from John Marshall High School. In 1993, she, along with her older sister, moved to Raleigh where she attended and graduated from Shaw University.

Karen holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders and a Masters Degree in Hospitality and Tourism. She is currently employed with Hewlett Packard Enterprises. She is the founder of PureKaret, a multifaceted business within the hospitality industry. She is an artist and a professional cake decorator. Her work is seen annually at the North Carolina State Fair.

Karen has rendered service to and through the Flood Group since early in its formation. Among her many contributions, she has served as corresponding secretary in which role she has been the lifeline of the group. 
improve social and economic outcomes for fathers to support their families. 100 current or recently incarcerated fathers will receive services as well. Derrick W. Byrd will assume the role of Program

Dr. Flood Honored

On October 3, 2015, Dudley Flood was honored at the Distinguished Alumni Awards Dinner of the School of Education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. The School gave its highest honor, the Peabody Award, to Dudley Flood and posthumously to Gene Causby who worked together for the NC Department of Public Instruction, providing assistance and guidance to school districts as they implemented desegregation orders during the 1970s. In presenting the award, Dean Bill McDiarman stated, "we are delighted to showcase these individuals and celebrate their contributions to the important work of education and equal opportunity. Each of these honorees has done meaningful work, and we take pride in having an opportunity celebrate their accomplishments."

It was noted that the two of them had worked with each of the 100 counties in North Carolina and with 49 of the fifty States, Washington, DC, Canada, Germany and Bermuda.
